

# **Kent County Fair Horse Program 2020**

**August 10-15**

# Welcome to the Kent County Youth Fair!

**Entering any class or event in the Horse Program at the 2020 Fair automatically declares agreement on the part of the exhibitor, leader and parent to the following:**

Showing at the Kent County Youth Fair is a privilege and responsibility for those exhibitors who have successfully completed all 2020 Horse Project requirements. Positive conduct, good sportsmanship, integrity and respect towards others are priorities at all times from exhibitors, parents and leaders above any class placing or award.

- All exhibitors and leaders in the horse division are subject to the rules and regulations defined by the Michigan Department of Agriculture, the Kent County Fair Board and the Kent County Horse Leaders Association.
  - Any violation may mean forfeiture of points, premiums, and/or awards, in addition to possibly being banned from further competition in the Horse Program and/or all project areas.
  - Complete Kent County Horse Rules and Regulations can be obtained from the MSU Extension Office.
- The project animal can be owned by the exhibitor or borrowed/leased from someone else as long as the exhibitor has had the major responsibility of caring for and working with the project animal since May 1 of the current project year. The emphasis is on the time and effort the youth puts into his/her project animal.
- It is required that all project horses have a negative Coggins test on or after September 1
- It is required that all project horses be immunized against the minimum of Tetanus, Eastern/Western Encephalomyelitis, Rabies and West Nile.
- Animals 56" and under, which are over 5 years of age, may be shown in pony classes if available. When measuring ponies, ½" will be deducted from measurement if the pony has shoes.
- All members and visitors are to be out of the barns at closing time, 10:00 pm each night
- Only Barn Captains, Horse Leader Executive Committee members or Security have authorized access after closing.
- Removal of ANY exhibit and/or project animal prior to the published release time of **Saturday, August 15 from 5:00pm to 8pm, or after 10pm** without prior written permission from the Horse Superintendent, will be fined the amount of premiums; and forfeit ALL ribbons and trophies in ALL project areas. See the Kent County Youth Fair – Early Release Policy in the Fair Premium book for further detail.
- Project animals may only be schooled by the exhibitor unless prior arrangements have been made with the Horse Leader Executive Committee.
- Each club is responsible to clean their own area in the horse barn including the aisle way and stalls at the completion of fair, removing ALL items; trash, debris, bedding and manure. The Fair Board has the right to fine a club the amount of premiums and cost of clean-up if this is not complied with.
- No pets (including dogs), bikes or remote controlled toys are to be used in the areas designated for horses.
- No smoking in or around the horse barns, arenas, or tack/feed trailer areas
- The make-up ring is for those waiting for upcoming classes and not for schooling
- Exhibitors using the exercise arena must follow the rules for that arena
- Longeing is allowed in designated fenced-in areas only. No free longeing allowed.

## 2020 Guidelines & Requirements

**Order of Go** – there will be Order of Go in Contesting, Jumping, Equitation over Poles, and Dressage. All other classes will run first come, first serve.

**Dress Code** (applies to all horse project area functions)

- The following dress code applies to all exhibitors and their families:
  - No clothing promoting alcohol, tobacco, drugs, profanity, sex or any other negative connotations.
  - All undergarments (bras, sports bras, camisoles, underwear, boxers, etc.) must be covered up.
  - No clothing with excessively large holes/tears (includes shirts, pants/shorts) or shirts torn down the sides.
  - All shorts must have a minimum of a 2" inseam.
  - Everyone must wear shirts.
  - No flip-flops, sandals, open-toed, crocs (or knock-offs) are to be worn in or around the barns or horse traffic areas.
- The following footwear code applies to all exhibitors handling/riding an equine:
  - Exhibitors must always wear boots or shoes designed for horseback riding when handling or riding at 4-H events. Handling includes but is not limited to leading, riding, bathing, and cleaning stalls.
  - Tennis shoes are not acceptable when riding or handling your equine.
  - Footwear code is a state rule that can be viewed under the Horse and Pony Project Show Rules & Regulations at <http://web1.msue.msu.edu/cyf/youth/horse/horserules.html>.
- The following consequences will apply:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> violation – a warning will be given to change or cover up.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> violation – the Kent County Horse Leaders Executive Committee will ask the offender to leave the grounds.

### Primary/Secondary Horse

- Exhibitor may only enter each class once.
- Exhibitor may not take primary horse and secondary horse in same class.
- Only Junior Advanced – Horsemaster eligible to bring 2 horses to fair
- Both horses must stay the entire week

### Dropping & Adding Classes

- Please sign the drop list at the Entry Booth for classes you wish to drop as soon as possible with the exception of team performance which cannot be dropped after 8pm on Wednesday.
- You may add classes at the Entry Booth by 8:00pm the night before the class with the exception of dressage classes which must be added by noon on Tuesday and Team Performance which must be added by Wednesday at 8pm.

## **Class Splits**

- Classes will be split at 14 riders and will be posted on the bulletin boards.
- Riders must ride in their posted splits.
- Splits are expected in most Walk Trot and Novice Division rail classes and some Junior Intermediate rail classes.

## **Grand and Reserve Showmanship Championship Class (Monday afternoon)**

- All exhibitors placing 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> in a Showmanship class may enter
- Exhibitors must show in the discipline they won the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, or 3<sup>rd</sup> using the horse they qualified with (i.e. Western, Hunt Seat, Saddle Seat)
- Two Showmanship Grand & Reserve Champions (chosen from the levels Nov Intermediate-Horsemaster ) will be invited to show in the Kent County Showmanship Sweepstakes on Saturday in the Reath Barn. One exhibitor will be fair age 13-15 yrs and another exhibitor fair age 16-19 yrs.

## **Grand & Reserve Equitation Championship Class (Thursday evening)**

- Classes qualifying for the corresponding Grand & Reserve class are noted with an \* in the program.
- All exhibitors placing 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in Equitation (includes Equitation Over Fences) classes may enter.
- Exhibitors must show in the discipline they won the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> using the horse they qualified with (i.e. Western, Hunt Seat, Equitation Over Fences, Dressage, Saddle Seat, Gymkhana).

**Horseless Showmanship – this is a judged class but does NOT qualify for the Grand and Reserve Showmanship Championship Class. Class will be in Ring A. (Monday afternoon)**

**Explorer Showmanship and Patterns – Explorers MUST wear name tag that was placed in record book for ALL events. ALL classes will be in Ring A (Monday afternoon)**

**Mentors must be 18 years or older for events with a horse (showmanship, patterns, and rail classes)**

- Helmets must be worn by all explorers
- If you are sharing a horse please let the show manager know
- 7 yr old Showmanship - When finished please saddle up for your riding classes.
- 6 yr old Showmanship – Mentor must have lead line attached to horse for safety reasons. When finished please saddle up for your riding classes.
- 5 yr old Showmanship -Mentor must have lead line attached to horse for safety reasons.
- 7 yr old Riding Pattern - Please come saddled up and ready to ride as soon as your showmanship class is finished. Pattern to be completed one at a time with mentor in arena.
- 7 yr old Equitation Rail Class - Mentor (1 per explorer) must be in arena with explorer, however, they do not have to walk right next to them.
- 6 yr old Riding Pattern – Please come saddled up and ready to ride as soon as your showmanship class is finished. Pattern to be completed one at a time with mentor in arena.
- 7 yr old Pleasure Rail Class – Mentor (1 per explorer) must be in arena with explorer, however, they do not have to walk right next to them.

### **Jumping (Monday evening)**

- All jumping riders **MUST** be evaluated by a jumping evaluator for their level. Riders moving up to a new level need a new evaluation. The rider must submit their completed jumping evaluation form at the time their project book is due in order to participate in jumping events.
- All walk/trot equitation over pole riders **MUST** be evaluated by a horse leader. (Does not have to be a jumping evaluator.) The rider must submit their completed evaluation form at the time their project book is due in order to participate in ground poles.
- Protective leg wraps and martingales are prohibited in hunter hack.

### **Hunt Seat Disciplined Pattern (Tuesday)**

- The class is intended to encompass skills that should be possessed by any hunt seat equitation rider, namely:
  - Strong position, especially lower body
  - Excellent control over the horse's frame
- Each level has a pattern to reflect the skills expected at that level.
- If you have questions, don't be afraid to ask your leader!

### **Bareback Equitation (Tuesday)**

- All seats are combined for bareback equitation.
- Helmets are required for all riders regardless of seat.
- Riders winning 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> may compete in Grand and Reserve equitation.

### **Horsemaster Freestyle Presentations-ALL horsemasters must participate (Tuesday evening)**

- Presentation Applications and Bios are due the same time as Project Books – submitted separately and neatly printed or typed please.
- Presentations may be 7 minutes long including set-up and tear down.
- Presentations are mandatory

### **Contesting (Tuesday afternoon, Wednesday evening, and Friday afternoon)**

See Michigan 4-H Rules and Regulations AND Kent County 4-H Rules and Regulations for complete list.

- Appointments of the Rider:
  - Approved safety headgear required (ASTM-SEI).
  - Approved footwear with heel required.
  - Shirt must be long sleeved and tucked in – no club jackets.
  - Western tie/scarf and belts are optional.
- Appointments of the Horse:
  - All horses must wear a breast collar (western) or breast plate (English).
  - Refer to appointments in rule book.
- No re-run will be given other than to break a tie for placing or for a problem caused by an official.
- It's the rider's responsibility to be ready and on time to run.
- Entries will be read over the PA system – Rider will be called on deck – then called to run – A 5 second last call will be given before moving on to the next entry.
- Riders may not enter the arena until the previous rider has safely exited.
  - Rider must be MOUNTED when entering the arena.
  - Horse and rider may NOT be led into the arena.
  - Horses may not run through the gate.
- Riders must dismount and lead out of the arena after their ride.

### **English Dressage (Wednesday morning) HELMET REQUIRED-entries due Tuesday at noon**

Dressage Goals & Guidelines:

- Freedom and regularity of gaits.
- Harmony, lightness and ease of the movements.
- Lightness of the forehand and the engagement and impulsion of the hind quarters.
- Acceptance of the bit/bridle, submissiveness without signs of tenseness or resistance.

Correct Appointments: (See Michigan 4-H Rules and Regulations AND Kent County 4-H Rules and Regulations for complete list)

- Plain English snaffle bit and bridle (NO Pelhams or Kimberwicks allowed).
- Cavesons, flash, figure eight or dropped nosebands are allowed.
- Martingales, side reins or running reins are not allowed.

### **Western Dressage (Wednesday morning) entries due Tuesday at noon**

### **Dressage Seat Equitation (Wednesday afternoon) entries due Tuesday at noon**

- Exhibitors must participate in one English Dressage test to participate
- Western dressage not eligible

### **Gymkhana Equitation (Thursday afternoon)**

- Gymkhana is the Equitation class for dedicated contesting riders only.
- Anyone placing 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> in any previous Horsemanship/Equitation classes is NOT eligible for this class
- Exhibitors must have shown in a minimum of 3 contesting events prior to participating in this class.
- Appropriate and correct contesting appointments are required according to the Michigan 4-H Rules and Regulations.
- Exhibitors Equitation will be judged according to the correct position and aids for contesting.
- Horses are to be under control at all times. Bucking, rearing, racing, swapping leads and refusing to go forward and/or stand will be SEVERELY penalized.

### **Miniature Horse Classes – (Friday afternoon)**

- Miniature horses can to be trailered in for these classes with arrival after 11:30am
- Miniature horses need to be removed within an hour after the conclusion of class #522
- All levels can participate (Walk/Trot-Horsemaster)
- Miniature horses must be 38 inches or less
- Classes will be placed but do not receive points
- Miniature horses may not be ridden on fairgrounds
- Exhibitors may share horses (Friday mini classes only)
- Must clean up by your trailer before you leave

### **Team Performance (Friday evening)**

- Team Performance is for Novice Intermediate through Horsemaster riders only.
- Teams of four members will be selected from the entries and posted Thursday morning.
- Each rider on a team will ride in only one class
- One rider from each team will ride in the following classes:
  - Hunt Seat Equitation on the rail
  - Western Equitation on the rail
  - Down and Back
  - Simon Says
- Teams should organize a meeting on Thursday to determine which team member is riding which class.
- Teams should promote unity and team spirit
- Teams should stay together for all classes
- Casual clothing
- NO adds/drops of Team Performance after 8pm Wednesday
- Team scores for each class will be combined to determine the top 10 places by team. (Ribbons for top 6 teams)
- Individual scores will NOT be posted.

### **Proud Equestrian Program – PEP (Saturday morning)**

- Designed to provide opportunities to include fair eligible Kent County members with disabilities of a physical, developmental, or emotional nature.
- Riders can trailer in a horse for the classes with arrival at 8:30am, use the horse they declared for the week, or borrow a horse that is already at fair being used by another exhibitor
- All riders will be required to wear helmets for both riding and groundwork
- Riders should be able to ask their horses to walk forward, halt, turn left, and turn right
- Riders are responsible for providing their own volunteers
- Riders must control horse- Leader and side walkers are a safety element only
- Riders must be accompanied by their leader or parent/guardian for costume class
- Exhibitors may cross enter between their level classes during the week of fair and the PEP classes
- Classes may be shown in any discipline and with adaptive tack as needed
- Exhibitors must choose walk only equitation OR walk/trot equitation
- All classes can be entered independently or assisted
- Horses need to be removed within an hour of the conclusion of class #605
- Exhibitors may share horses in Showmanship, Obstacle Course, & Pattern (PEP classes only)
- Classes will be placed but do not receive points
- Must clean up by your trailer before you leave



## 2020 Combination, High Points and Awards

**Awards Ceremony** (Saturday afternoon)

### **COMBINATION AWARDS – One horse/one rider only**

- A High Point Combination Trophy will be given in each Division/Level.
- Exhibitors must participate in all point classes to be considered eligible for an award.
- Equitation classes will be used as the tie breaker (indicated in **BOLD**)
- Points will be given on a 6 points to 1 point basis according to placing, being pro-rated for under six riders. All DQ's and excused riders will count as riders
- Any member previously winning a High Point Combination Trophy is not eligible for that same award in that Division/Level – the exception being Horsemaster.

### **HIGH POINT TRAIL TROPHY**

- A High Point Trophy will be awarded to the highest trail score in each Division/Level.
- Tie breaking elements will be determined by the call judge and the Trail Chairman prior to the start of any trail class.
- Any member previously winning a High Point Trail Trophy is not eligible for that same award in that Division/Level- the exception being Horsemaster.

### **SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD**

- Nomination forms are located at the Entry Booth.
- Parents and members may nominate ONE person for the week.
- Leaders may nominate as often as they want and may nominate members from their own club.
- Nominations will be accepted at the Entry Booth until NOON on Friday.

### **HERDSMANSHIP**

- Individual clubs, stalls, tack stalls and area will be judged throughout each day on the cleanliness, safety, and activity in and around their stalls.
- Clubs will be judged on use of the fair theme and using a recycling container
- Barns will be judged once on Monday and twice each day Tuesday-Friday
- Club with the highest daily points awarded a prize for each member
- Clubs placed through 10<sup>th</sup> place for weekly high point

### **ALL AROUND HORSEMASTER AWARD**

- Points will be collated from total number of classes entered with any horse/rider combination
- Awarded to exhibitor who competes in the most disciplines and has the most points
- Award will be presented at awards ceremony
- Tie breaker will be determined based on overall points from Horsemaster Project Book
